Key Responsibilities: The STRIDE Program Tutor:

1) works with assigned students to provide assistance in one or more academic subjects

2) assists students to develop better understanding of in-class and homework assignments and projects

3) coaches the students in identifying resources to complete assignments

4) reviews assignments and suggests ways to improve or supplement assignments

5) provides feedback on the students' progress and encourages the students to focus on academic excellence

6) leads small group activities designed to expand students' knowledge beyond the classroom

7) engages in alternative learning activities to strengthen criticalthinking, decision-making, and conflict resolution skills

8) develops a positive and supportive relationship with students

Supervised by: Program Coordinator or Assistant Director

Length of Commitment: At least 4-5 months (or one school semester)

Time Commitment : 1) 2-4 hours per week

2) Volunteers must attend a two-hour orientation/training

session before being matched with students; and strongly encouraged

to attend ongoing periodic volunteer trainings

Qualifications: At least 18 years of age; holds at least a high school diploma;

and passes a background check
